Hines, Pickard Chilton Celebrate Topping-Out of Le Coeur in Düsseldorf

Adaptive Reuse and Historic Preservation Anchor New Sustainable Landmark on Düsseldorf's Königsallee

(New Haven, Conn. – June 4, 2025) – <u>Pickard Chilton</u>, an award-winning architecture studio best known for its innovative and cutting-edge design of corporate headquarters and commercial projects, joins Hines and project partners in celebrating the topping-out of <u>Le Coeur</u>, a next-generation office and retail destination in the heart of Düsseldorf's prestigious Königsallee boulevard.

As Design Architect, Pickard Chilton collaborated with RKW Architektur + as the Executive Architect, to reimagine the site of the former Commerzbank and Dresdener Bank headquarters as a contemporary development that brings together over 42,000 m2 (450,000 sf) of best-in-class office, retail shops, and restaurants. The name Le Coeur – French for 'The Heart' — reflects both its location at the center of one of Germany's most prestigious shopping streets and its architectural design, which places openness, connectivity, and human experience at its core.



"Le Coeur is a compelling example of how thoughtful architecture can reconcile historic context with bold, future-facing design," said William Chilton, FAIA RIBA, Principal at Pickard Chilton. "We're honored to work with Hines to create a building that embraces its surroundings while offering an entirely new pedestrian and urban experience for Düsseldorf."

In contrast to the rigid form of the previous structures, Le Coeur features gently curved volumes, open corners, and a series of fluid interconnections that invite people through the building via a central courtyard. This urban gesture not only enhances connectivity but also enriches the public realm along Königsallee.



More than 40 percent of the development consists of the adaptive re-use and re-cladding of the original structure, significantly reducing the project's embodied carbon. Key historic elements – including the monumental stone façade from the 1907 Commerzbank building – have been thoughtfully preserved and reintegrated. The project has already been awarded a DGNB Platinum pre-certificate and Smartscore certification, contributing to its advanced sustainability profile.

Upon completion in 2026, Le Coeur will serve as the new home for leading global tenants including Clifford Chance, Freshfields, and Noerr, and will stand as a model for sustainable urban transformation in one of Europe's premier business districts.
